## Little Caesar's Arena: Open for Business

Little Caesar's Arena, new home of the Detroit Red Wings and Pistons, officially opened its doors to the public on Tuesday, September 12. Detroit's prodigal son, Kid Rock, performed a series of six shows, debuting the new 19,600 seat, 785,000 square foot state-of-the-art arena to the world.

Red Wings fans got their first glimpse of the arena on September 23 during the team's first preseason game. The regular season home opener is set for October 5. Meanwhile, Pistons fans will have to wait a little longer for their first viewing. The team will play their first preseason game on October 4, while their regular season home opener is scheduled for October 18.

Little Caesar's Arena, the largest project in Limbach history, ended up totaling nearly \$1 billion. Limbach's portion of the work, which was a joint venture with Mechanical Systems by Lopez (MSL), accounted for approximately \$128 million of that total. Roughly 540,000 man hours were logged on Limbach's portion of the contract alone during this mammoth project.

A number of people such as Estimating Manager Doug Fecteau, LEDES Engineer Karl Stoolmiller, Sr. Project Manager Aaron Cowell, Account Manager Colin John and COO Kris Thorne invested considerable time and effort to ensure Limbach a seat at the table. Ultimately, Limbach joined the Little Caesar's Arena team in a design-assist manner in September of 2015, working on value engineering, estimating and helping to complete drawings and BIM coordination. After assisting with procurement of the project, Colin John took over as the account manager and served as the main point of contact for the joint venture as the prime HVAC contractor for the climate-specific building.

With efficiency and safety being the name of the game, the utilization of prefabricated toilet rooms, prefabricated mechanical pipe and sub-assembly of ducts has saved time and extraneous effort. The Trimble unit, which takes hanger locations from the 3D model and locates them in the field so no manual measuring is needed, has also been a huge help, given that this is a radius building with no straight columns.

A Central Energy Plant in the parking garage houses the arena's four water cooled chillers, four cell cooling towers on the roof, six boilers, and a domestic water heater. Prefabricated pump skids were utilized for the condenser water, chilled water, heating hot water, and includes a heat rejection system that will cool all the food service equipment such as coolers, refrigerators, ice makers and the beer coolers. It will also provide cooling for the ice plant chillers which makes the ice.

Additional equipment in the arena is scattered throughout eleven mechanical rooms, four of which condition only the bowl. In all, 29 air handling units, over 400 fan coil units and over 100 exhaust fans have been installed by Limbach.

Given the scope of the work and the challenges overcome, a few key personnel deserve recognition for a job well-done. Jason Pleave led arguably the most challenging BIM Coordination effort in company history. Project Manager Dave Zach kept the project flowing from day to day. Foremen Pat Sementkowski, Ken Ladwig and Mike Krebs dealt with challenges day after day in the field and overcame unbelievable odds to ensure both quality and efficiency.

After years of hard work by countless people around the Detroit area, the arena was deemed complete on September 1, 2017. Eleven nights later, the doors opened to the public, the curtains rose to the rafters and Kid Rock performed in front of 20,000 fans. The new centerpiece of the Detroit entertainment industry, Little Caesars Arena, was opened for business..

In the middle of his set, Kid Rock even gave a shout out to all of those who poured their blood, sweat and tears into the construction of the building. ""Let's thank the folks who built this place," Rock said humbly. "The construction workers, plumbers, electricians, architects... everyone who got their hands dirty to make this place a reality."

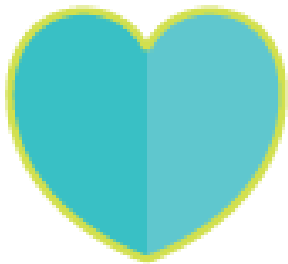

PORT HURON, MI - Have you ever said a word over and over again to the point where it seems to temporarily lose its meaning? Sometimes, a company's core values can be viewed that same way. Here at Limbach, we hear over and over again, "We Care." On August 21, Limbach employees didn't just talk the talk; they walked the walk.

Greg Brennan and Rob Chamberlin were both working on the McLaren Port Huron Hospital project in Port Huron, MI the day of the incident. Chamberlin had gone to find the job foreman, armed with an idea to improve jobsite safety. In the meantime, a tradesman in the area fell under duress and two nearby workers began yelling for help. Brennan rushed over, arriving just before Chamberlin and the foreman returned to the scene. They found the man on the ground, convulsing.

Both Limbach employees sprung into action. Brennan stayed with the man, attempting to keep him calm while also searching for a pulse.

"I stayed, just trying to keep the guy down, keep him calm," Brennan said. "Rob called 9-1-1 and went to find the safety director [Jason Thurau from Barton Malow]."

Upon returning to the scene, Chamberlin suggested rolling the man onto his side to keep him from choking. Less than four minutes had elapsed between the call and arrival of the ambulance. By that time, the man's heart had stopped. Paramedics performed CPR and revived him with an automated external defibrillator.

"Everyone kind of came together to help," Chamberlin humbly explained. "The quick response by the ambulance was what saved his life."

The man is currently in stable condition at home. He is expected to make a full recovery, at least in some part thanks to the actions of our co-workers Brennan and Chamberlin.

## Charlie Bacon on Fox Business News

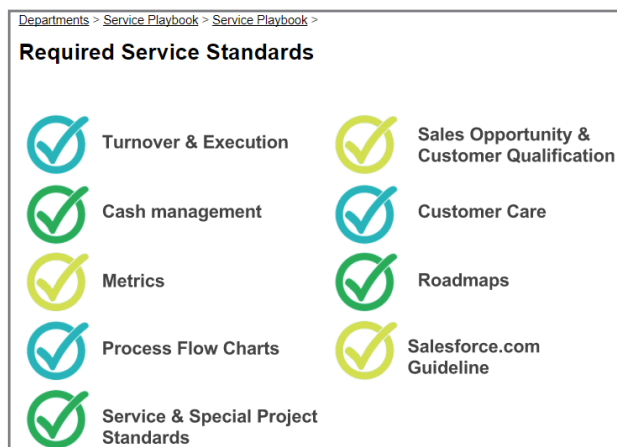


## The Intranet's Newest Addition: An Updated Service Playbook

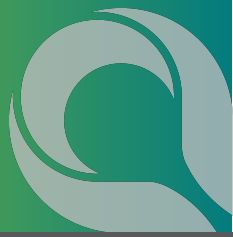


## LEDS Happy Hour

# Health & Wellness





**Contrary to popular belief, you don't need to go to the gym to have an effective workout. Here's an easy way to incorporate exercise into your daily routine whether in the office or the field.**


Try these 5 quick moves before lunch!

**1.**  10 bodyweight squats. Whether your goal is to get stronger, tone up or lose weight, squats are one of the fastest ways to get there. They target every muscle in your body and do wonders at increasing flexibility. You'll want to stand with your feet slightly wider than your hips with your toes pointed slightly out, keep your back straight and squat down until your hip joint is lower than your knees. If you don't have the strength to do 10 every time, start small and build up every day.

**2.**  10 press ups. An incredibly effective strength building exercise, press ups (or push ups) work both your chest and arm muscles. If you can't quite do a full press-up on the floor, put your knees down to help or even do them against your kitchen worktop or the wall.

**3.**  10 bodyweight lunges on each leg. Another excellent bodyweight exercise that works your glutes, quadriceps, hamstrings and core muscles.  
Make sure your back is straight as you go through the movement.

**4.**  10 calf raises. This exercise targets your calf muscles but works your entire body as you are using your whole body weight. You can do this on the kitchen floor or, even better, on the edge of a step. Lift as high as you can onto your toes and then lower your heels down as much as your ankles will allow. Try and push evenly through the entire width of your foot - you can hold onto the wall if you're having trouble balancing.

**5.**  10 tricep dips. A fantastic way to really target the back of your arms, tricep dips can be done against the kitchen worktop or a stable kitchen chair. Position your hands shoulder-width apart on your chair or kitchen bench and move your bottom off the bench, extending your legs in front of you. Lower your body as low as you can go and then push back up until your arms are straight (try and keep a little bend in the elbows to keep your joints happy).

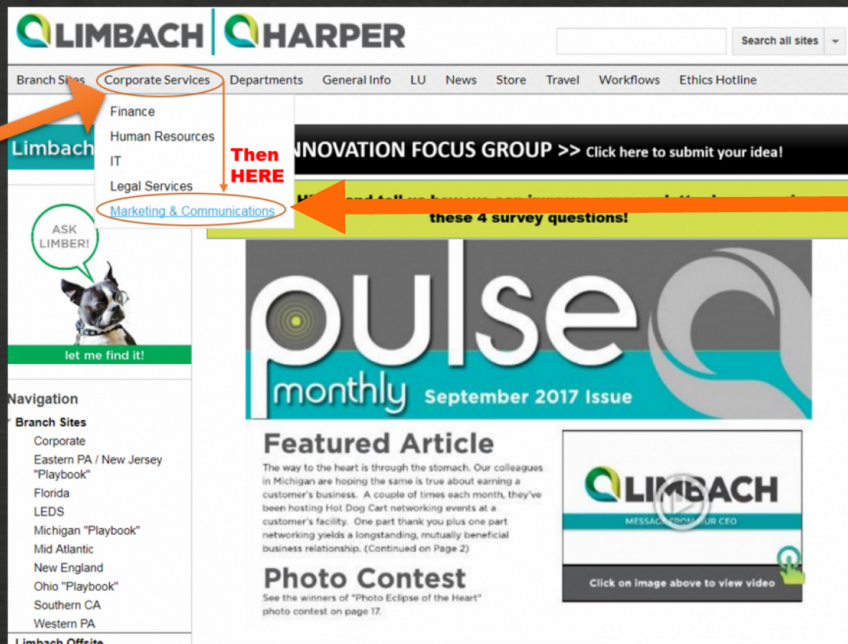

## "30 Compressions and 2 Breaths"

PHILADELPHIA, PA - On September 13th, the Eastern PA Branch learned the meaning of life...or at least how to save one in an emergency. EPA's Safety Manager Ken Gallagher invited the American Red Cross to teach branch personnel how to perform CPR and learn First Aid basics. Six hours later, 12 EPA individuals were certified to save lives and limbs.

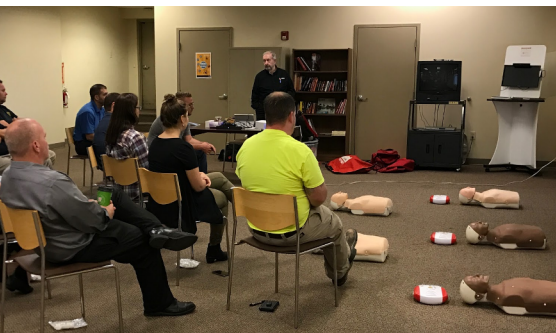
Accounting Clerk, Ashley Kramer praised the experience, saying, "I'm grateful to have had the opportunity to learn such valuable life skills. I'm better prepared to protect my family or those around me from life threatening and non-life threatening conditions and illnesses with confidence. I most likely would have never thought to sign up for this class like this on my own accord; I'm happy to have had the chance to participate."

Neal Ryan, EPA's Service Estimator and Project Manager, commented, "It was good to learn the updated methods of CPR, and it was especially good to learn how to operate the AED (Automated External Defibrillator). They weren't used or available the last time I took a First Aid class."

Newly Certified Mike Milligan, one of EPA's Project Sales Representatives, offered a similar sentiment, "I had already been through a CPR course but had no idea how to use a defibrillator. I pray that I never have to use one, but I am glad that I now know how. It was an interesting program from start to finish."

Gallagher wrapped up the session by saying, "This is like anything else. To be proficient at something, you must practice."

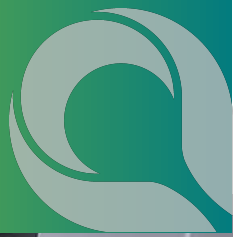
